

Question: I don't understand why I don't do what I really want to do. Why don't I follow my choices?

Reply: You are in good company with the lament of not being able to follow your own choices! Paul also cries, "Why is it the things I would do, I cannot, and that which I would not do is what I do!"

Why? When you go back to the Aramaic Y'Shua, he is teaching physics and physiology, not religion! There are 2 minds we can function out of. One is the Mind that He used, the Mind of Christ, where there is truly choice, the other is the inertia bound pseudo-mind of the past, stored in our carbon based memory systems. It has all the decisions of a thousand generations in it and its propensity to do what it is going to do is legendary, regardless of our choices.

The body, being a carbon based device, appears to have a mind of its own, but it is not truly a mind, it is more an automatic, computer like function that has stored in it, past thoughts, feelings, realities and behaviors that have been received energetically in our DNA. When a situation resonates one of those old behaviors, they take over and choice is gone. In the ancient Scriptures it was called the anti-Christ and its number is 666. The atomic number of carbon is 6 - 6 electrons, 6 protons, 6 neutrons, hence the reference to the inertia bound "mind" that takes away our choices and locks us into the mind of the past, unable to follow the simplest choices we make.

The work of Y'Shua was that of, "overcoming" the propensity of carbon based memory, with its insane and loveless decisions, to control us. To remove old realities is called True Forgiveness. It has nothing to do with letting others, or ourselves, off the hook for what has been done, but, rather, is the tool with which you go into carbon based memory and remove what never should have been there in the first place. It removes the ability that carbon based memory has to remove us from choice and restore us to our rightful place, able to do the things He did and greater, because, no longer controlled by the past, there is actual choice.

An intensive is an opportunity to do a large piece of one's own work. If the use of the tools is not continued, however, the enormity of the carbon based systems data, "disappears" our new choices and understanding in its mass. Perhaps it is time for an Intensive and time to do the next piece of your work??
